### Location: Villa Aurora

The home of German writer and intellectual Lion Feuchtwanger and his wife Marta. It was a center of the artistic émigré community in the 30s and 40s. Today, Villa Aurora Foundation for European-American Relations is owned by the Friends of Villa Aurora and hosts- with the support of the German government- a year-round artist-in residence program.

Built in 1941 for Thomas Mann, this house served as the Manns' LA residence for over a decade. He wrote many of his major works here, such as Doctor Faustus and Felix Krull.
